HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

S.R.R & C.V.R Govt. Degree College (Autonomous), Vijayawada was established in 1937 by two illustrious personalities, Sri Rajah Venkatadri Apparao Bahudur, Zamindar of Nuzvid and Sri. Chunduri Venkata Reddy, a local Industrialist and Philanthropist, S.R.R. & C.V.R. Government Degree College (A), Vijayawada has evolved progressively with a purpose to meet the higher education needs of students from economically weak sections of the society, in particular Krishna district of Andhra Pradesh.

Located amidst lush greenery, the college is spread over an area of about seven acres in a prime locality of Machavaram, Vijayawada. The ambience is eco -friendly and fosters a sense of unity with nature and a zeal for life-long learning.

The college is the only Government College in Vijayawada city and the donors handed over the college to the Govt. of A.P. with effect from 01-07-1958 vide G.O.Ms. No. 1691 Edn. Dt.29-6-1958. The College was affiliated to the Andhra University till December, 1976 and later to Acharya Nagarjuna University by an Act of the State Legislature, Andhra Pradesh in 1991 and finally from 2010-11 onwards, the College is under Krishna University, Machilipatnam and is functioning strong with recognitions by U.G.C. including 2 (f) and 12 (b) status

Since its inception in the year 1937, the college continues to be nurtured, nourished by a galaxy of eminent educationists who worked as Principals and faculty members over the years. The college has a glorious history of having intellectual stalwarts like the first Jnanapeet Awardee, Kavisamrat Sri Viswanadha Satyanarayana and Sri. Jonnalagadda Satyanarayana as faculty. The Institution also has the unique distinction of display of alumni including reputed academicians, experts, statesmen and celebrities in various fields both in India and abroad. Among the luminaries, the college mentions with pride the names of Sri. N. T. Rama Rao, former Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, His Excellency Sri. P. S .Rama Mohana Rao, former Governor of Tamilnadu and His Excellency Sri.V. Rama Rao, former Governor of Sikkim.

The college has been offering traditional courses since 1998 but from the academic year 1998-1999 onwards, the college included restructured programmes in Science, Arts and Commerce, providing thus a wide platter of course combinations at an affordable and serviceable fee to orient students towards research and workplace demands that keep changing in the present challenging environment. The total strength of the under graduate courses is 2105 and the total strength of the Postgraduate courses is 145. As a co-educational institution it is in demand students from the schedule castes, scheduled tribes and listed backward classes account for 68% of the total admitted strength and the remaining 32% of students belong to economically backward and under privileged sections of the society.

Teaching Learning process is blended to do justice to the multi-dimensional programmes offered. Students have the opportunity to undertake projects, industrial training and internships to make them confident and job ready. Students are equally engaged in a variety of co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and varied initiatives like the Women Empowerment Cell, Inclusive Clubs, Red Ribbon clubs and Eco clubs inculcate awareness

and social responsibility on gender equality, anti-human trafficking, Drug abuse and environment friendly practices.

The College, located in the heart of the city is accessible by road and rail transport system and has state-of-the-art infrastructure. Facilities include Virtual and Digital classrooms, spacious library with an exclusive Reading room, Computer labs, Science labs, Auditorium, Indoor stadium, Gymnasium, Cafeteria and many others. The college is also a Web counselling centre for Engineering, Agriculture and Medicine common entrance test (EAMCET) and also for various CETs conducted by Govt. of A.P.

The college has the best minds as faculty members to guide students. All 22 undergraduate and 8 postgraduate academic programmes are handled by 74 regular faculty members, including Principal, 03 Contract Faculty, more than 20 Guest Faculty and 37 non-teaching staff. The total strength of the under graduate courses is 2105 and the total strength of the Postgraduate courses is 145.

The institution which is quality conscious went for NAAC accreditation in 2004 and was awarded B++ Grade with 81.25 percentage of points The college was re-accredited with 'B' Grade (CGPA 2.70) by NAAC in 2010-11 and completed its third cycle in 2017 with 'B' Grade (CGPA 2.60).

Guidelines for SC/ST/BC fresh Scholarship Applications

Andhra Pradesh government has launched a scholarship scheme. This scheme will get implemented for financial support to the students residing in the state. Andhra Pradesh Jagan Anna Vidya Deevana scheme will take the burden of fees for the higher education of poor students. Those students who are capable of studying higher education but cannot afford it due to financial issues will get this scholarship. Here in this article, we have discussed the Jagananna Vidya Deevana scheme. Also provided details related to application form status and final list.

Full fee reimbursement is applicable under the Jagan Anna Vidya Deewana scheme. For session of 2019-2020 Jagan Anna Vasathi Devena annually 20000 rupees are provided to each student for accommodation and food expenses. This deevana card is applicable for all the students pursuing Polytechnic, ITI, degree and graduate-level courses from government, semi-private colleges affiliated under state university or board.

1. Annual income of all family must be below 2.5 lacs
2. Applicant family must have below 10 acre wet land, 25 acre dry land or 25 acre wet and dry land.

3. No family member should belong from any government work or pensioners are not included under this scheme. However, all the sanitary workers are exempted from this.
4. The family must not own four-wheeler vehicle. However taxi auto tractors are exempted.
5. Any member of the family must not be eligible to pay income tax.
6. Family must not have plot area of build up above 1500 square feet in Municipal area

Documents Required For Application

Eligible applicants have to apply for getting benefit of scheme. All they need to produce application form along with following documents. Applicant must prepare list of this document at the time of filling application form. List of documents are:-

1. Domicile certificate
2. Aadhar card
3. voter ID card
4. College admission certificate
5. Admission fee receipt
6. Below poverty line or E W S certificate
7. Proof of land
8. Proof of vehicle
9. Non-tax paying declaration
10. Account details of any Bank
11. Occupational details of parents
12. Passport size photograph

General rules of Discipline

The College is a community in which a large number of people live together. It is therefore essential that all members have due regard for the rights of others. The Principal/ faculty looks after the disciplinary matters and problems arising from a breach of the College rules. The College rules are intended to help preserve a happy and harmonious atmosphere for all those living and working in the College.

- Students of the college are expected to conduct themselves with in and outside the college in accordance with the best standard of manners and good behavior.
- Soon after admission each student will be given an identity card which he/she should always carry with him/her and produce on demand.
- Students are required to make as little noise as possible in the college premises and in moving from one room to another room.
- No student shall be allowed to leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher or until the class is dismissed.

- Any student who is persistently insubordinate, who is repeatedly or willfully mischievous, who is guilty of fraud or malpractice in connection with examinations and who is in the opinion of the Principal is likely to have an unwholesome influence on his fellow students shall be removed from the rolls.
- The removal shall be either temporarily or permanent according to the gravity of the offence.
- Students are expected to help maintain the premises of the college tidy, clean and healthy and abstain from disfiguring the walls by sticking notices or by scribbling spitting in open spaces and other similar un civic acts.
- Dustbins are placed at important corners and all waste materials such as paper bits, leaves etc., should be deposited in them.

ATTENDANCE

The students should fulfill the minimum required attendance for every programme both theory and practical. Students failing to meet this prerequisite will not be eligible for certification at the end of the programmes.

- A student absent from the college for more than fifteen consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to have his/her name removed from the rolls.
- Absence without leave for part of a day will entail forfeiture of attendance for the whole day.
- The minimum attendance prescribed to write examinations is three fourth of the number of working days in the semester. Exemption from shortage of attendance can be granted on the recommendation of the Principal only. Student can pay the condonation amount as applicable.
- A student deputed to participate in matches, tournaments and sports events should submit his/her leave application duly recommended by the Physical Director to the HoD (main subject) for necessary action not later than one week after the completion of the event.
- The maximum period for which duty leave can be granted to a student for sports and athletic activities will be limited to 10% of the total number of working days.

RAGGING

Ragging in any form is strictly forbidden by law. The students should not be found involved in ragging. Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited. Whosoever, directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within or outside any educational institution shall, on conviction be punished with imprisonment and dismissed from the educational institution.

UNIFORM

To regulate discipline and uphold decorum, a prescribed dress code is to be observed by students, which requires that they be formally dressed while on campus.

- Without any membership fee, all neighbourhood public shall be given free access to newspapers, magazines, journals, reference books and other learning resources in the Reading Room, particularly to those preparing for Competitive Examinations.

Book Loans

- All students, faculty and staff of the College have the privilege of taking book-loans from library
- User must be a registered student/staff in the current term to be able to use library services
- All users must produce their ID Cards while taking book-loan from library
- Only text books having more than three copies shall be loaned.
- Reference books and Competitive books shall be issued overnight/during holidays, which must be deposited at 10:00 AM sharp on the next working day/at reopening of College after holidays.
 - Timings in Working Days: 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM
 - Overnight Issues of Reference Books: Only after 7:00 PM on all Working days/Weekends
- An overview of the entitlement of various categories of users, number of the books they can borrow and the period of loan:

Circulation

- Books shall be issued for a fortnight except Reference & Competitive Examination books, which shall be issued for overnight use only.
- Single copy textbooks shall not be issued.
- Students shall be allowed to reserve already issued books at the Circulation Counter.
- Books in demand shall not be renewed.
- Readers shall be fully responsible for books issued against their names.
- Library reserves the right to recall any issued book at any time, even much before the due date.
- The material such as rare books, theses, dissertations, loose issues of periodicals etc. marked for consultation shall not be issued.
- Borrowers must satisfy about the physical condition of the books before borrowing, otherwise they will be held responsible for any damage later or at the time of return.

Use of Computers/Laptops etc.

- Computer/Laptop in the library premises should be used for academic purposes only.
- Online chatting/dating, browsing of social networking sites is strictly prohibited. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulters.
- Playing games on computers/laptops is strictly prohibited in the entire Library premises.
- Only users producing their ID cards shall be allowed to use Computers/laptops in library.
- Users shall not pass their credentials to anyone inside/outside the College campus. Any discrepancy in this regard shall attract suspension of membership.
- Changing the settings and display of the computers/laptops kept in the Library is not permitted.
- Readers should not remove/unplug computer cables/connections, network cables and other peripherals/accessories in the library.
- Personal keyboard, mouse, etc., are not allowed inside the Library.
- Students shall take care of their Pen drives, CD/DVD ROMs, mobiles and wallets etc., lose or damage of which shall not attract any responsibility of library staff.

General rules

- Visitors shall respect the sanctity of Library and observe all rules & regulations in true letter and spirit.
- Personal belongings like bags, umbrellas, etc. should be deposited at the luggage area. These are not allowed inside the Library. Visitors are advised not to leave their valuable items like money, passport, credit/debit card etc. at the luggage area.
- All visitors should scan their ID Cards, sign the gate register while entering the library or reading room.
- Library reading areas are meant strictly for individual study and research only. Strict silence, decorum and discipline must be maintained in the Library.
- Using Mobile phones for Calls/Chatting is not permissible inside the Library premises.
- Eating, drinking, sleeping and talking loudly in the Library is strictly prohibited.

- Users should not rest or keep their feet on tables, chairs, shelves, etc.
- While taking books from reference racks, the users should enter the book details in the Reference Books Usage Register.
- Marking, scratching, damaging, mutilating, stealing, library materials or property will invite disciplinary action against the defaulters.
- Readers should not carry books outside the library unless they are issued.
- Books taken out of the shelves or racks must be left on the table. Users shall not replace the book on shelves for they may be misplaced.
- Users should switch-off the lights and fans before leaving the area they sit.
- The Librarian reserves the right to suspend the membership of any member found misbehaving with the library staff or with any other member.

ADHERENCE TO TIME SCHEDULE

The student should reach college in time and attend the lecture as per the time table given to them. The student should complete all the term work such as journals, drawing sheets, workshop jobs or any other assignment as per scheduled. The students and parents should specially note that if the students fail to complete the term work regularly and to the entire satisfaction of the Head of the institute, he/she will not be allowed to appear in the semester end examination.

National Service Scheme

National service scheme is offered to the students of our college has two NSS units namely NSS Unit-I and NSS Unit-II. Each unit is under the control of Programme Officer who is solely responsible for the entire working of unit. He/ She is guided by the principal and some senior staff members of the college.

Every year the NSS units will conduct special camps both in rural and urban settings. Some of the selected students will participate in the camps free of cost and get camp certificates from the university. Camp certificates carry additional weightage and value to those who wish to get jobs in the Government services and voluntary bodies and admissions into higher studies.

Revised CBCS Curriculum Framework (NEP-2020)

The revised syllabus is in effect from 2020-21 for I year. The following are the highlights of the revised syllabus which is in effect from the present academic year:

1. Life Skill Courses: 4 Life Skill Courses with a choice, in place of earlier 10 compulsory foundation courses. The objectives are to inculcate the required simple life-long skills and to prepare the students for the world of work.

2. Skill Development Courses: A new set of 4 Skill Development Courses are offered. These courses are intended to train students in broad-based multiple career oriented general skills in Arts, Commerce and Science streams

3. Core Courses: Three core courses of Domain subjects will be offered in the first three semesters, and the fourth and fifth courses will be in the fourth semester. The syllabus of these core courses is redesigned to suit the current needs of the domain knowledge, removing redundant and repetitive topics.

4. Skill Enhancement Courses: Two Skill Enhancement Courses will be offered for each domain subject, in Semester V. The two Skill Enhancement Courses of each domain subject will be linked for a wider basic and practical experience to students.

5. Research: Semesters VII and VIII include research project along with theory courses on research methodology. A few of the courses will be generic in nature while the others will be domain specific. A dissertation needs to be submitted based on the research project done.

6. Co-curricular activities play an important role in promoting experiential self-learning and field-based learning in students, especially in learning higher order skills. Hence

each of the core papers have a list of co-curricular activities to be undertaken with assessment.

7. Credits are given for participating in NCC / NSS / NGC, etc.

8. Extra Credits can be earned through Online Courses or Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) or add-on certificate courses.

9. The system of credit transfer to facilitate students getting better training at appropriate places is also introduced.

10. To ensure inculcating social responsibility and compassionate commitment among the students, the summer vacation in the intervening 1st and 2nd years of study shall be for Community Service is made mandatory.

11. To make the students employable, an Apprenticeship / Internship / On the job training shall be undertaken by the students in the intervening summer vacation between the 2nd and 3rd years.

12. During the entire 6th Semester, the student shall undergo Apprenticeship / Internship / On the Job Training. This is to ensure that the students develop hands on technical skills which will be of great help of in facing the world of work.

13. The revised CBCS is more skill oriented and employable and work ready, without jeopardizing the vertical mobility of the students.
