
As per the norms of CBCS 1st Year BA/BCom/BSc/BBA Skill Development Course (**Survey and Reporting**) has introduced in semester – II only.

1. The committee has approved the syllabus with **3 Units**.

2. The committee has approved the Model Question Paper for external exam - 50 marks and is divided as follows,
 - a. In Section A, answer **any 4** out of 8 Questions. Each one carries **5 marks**, totalling to **20 marks**. At least 1 question should be given from each Unit.
 - b. In Section B, answer **any 3** questions.. Each question carries **10 marks** totalling to **30 marks**. At least 1 question should be given from each Unit.
 - c. Time Duration – 1 1/2hrs (90 Minutes).
3. The committee has approved the Blue Print of the question paper. Question paper has to be designed in such a way that **16 marks have to be obtained from each unit/Module**.
4. The HOD has to prepare the list of Examiners and Paper Setters and will be submitted to the Academic Council.
5. Modifications, if need be in the above resolutions, will be done by The HOD and the faculty members of the department.

The committee has approved that all the above resolutions will be effective for **three years** i.e., 2020-21, 2021 -22, 2022-23 academic years.



He apprised the members of the guidelines of the UGC and the CCE regarding approval of syllabus, and the recommended evaluation ratio for internal and external examinations. The members discussed in detail the various aspects presented before them and unanimously resolved the following:

Bridge Course - '**Basics of Economics**' for the first year BA students

1st Year BA I semester consists of 1 paper paper-I – **Micro Economics Analysis**.

1st Year BA II semester consists of 1 paper paper-II – **Macro Economic Analysis**

2nd Year BA III semester consists of 1 paper paper-III – **Macro Economics – I**.

3rd Year BA V semester consists of 2 papers paper-V - **Contemporary Indian Economy** and paper-VI - **Quantitative Techniques**.

In paper-V more emphasis on all topics should be with reference to their current status. Discussion of theoretical aspects is not expected.

In paper-VI Mathematical derivations and proofs are not required. Only applications are enough.




5. The committee has Re-approved the syllabus with **5 Units for paper-III in Semesters III**
6. The committee has Re-approved the syllabus with **5 Units for each paper i.e paper-V and paper-VI in Semester V.**
7. The committee has approved the Model Question Papers for external exams - 60 marks and is divided as follows,
 - a. In Section A, answer **any 5** out of 10 Questions. Each one carries **4 marks**, totaling to **20 marks**. From each Unit/Module 2 questions have to be selected.
 - b. In Section B, answer **all 5** questions. Each question has internal choice. Each question carries **8 marks** totaling to **40 marks**. Each question has to be selected from each unit/Module.
 - c. Time Duration – 3 Hours. (On the request of the Students)

9. The committee has approved the Blue Print of the question paper. Question paper has to be designed in such a way that **24 marks have to be obtained from each unit/Module.**
